For many years this traditional world-renowned conference attracts close to 3,000 delegates from all over the globe, and has set the benchmark in primary therapy of early breast cancer. The conference is acclaimed for its high level quality as well as its eminent speakers representing the best in breast cancer research and therapy worldwide. The highlight of the congress is the St. Gallen Breast Cancer Consensus conference on Saturday, in which up to 60 experts engage in a discussion and live-voting process on therapy of early breast cancer, which shapes treatment procedures for the coming two years. Participants are sure to witness history in the making for the good of breast cancer patients worldwide.
